The Council for American Students in International Negotiations (CASIN), along with the Advisory Board of *Eyes on the International Criminal Court*, invites quality submissions for its twelfth volume from practitioners, scholars, jurists, and professionals. Occasionally, exceptional student work will be accepted.

Description: Eyes on the ICC is the first peer-reviewed, scholarly journal devoted to the study of the International Criminal Court. This publication seeks to advance the understanding of the ICC as well as promote positive relations between the international criminal law community and the United States. Eyes on the ICC publishes papers and book reviews from diverse perspectives that examine the ICC and related areas of international criminal law and human rights.

Requirements: Articles and notes may range in length from 4,000 to 15,000 words. Book reviews may range from 1,000 to 2,500 words. Submissions should adhere closely to *The Chicago Manual of Style* and cite sources in legal format according to *The Bluebook: A Uniform System of Citation*. Additionally, authors are encouraged to seek comments on their manuscripts from colleagues within their discipline. Prior to publication, submissions will be subject to external, double-blind peer review. So far, 2016 has been an eventful year; for volume 12 we would be interested in publishing articles covering (1) ICC's conviction of Jean-Pierre Bemba Gombo, (2) ICC's termination of the case against Kenya's Deputy President William Ruto and journalist Joshua Arap Sang, and (3) ICTY's conviction of Radovan Karadzic.

How to Apply: Manuscripts must be computer-generated and submitted electronically via e-mail to icc@americanstudents.us, or via Berkeley Electronic Press's ExpressO submission service, at http://law.bepress.com/expresso. Each submission should contain an abstract, the author's curriculum vitae, appropriate contact information, and a cover letter.

Deadline: Manuscripts will be accepted on a rolling basis.
